The Grand Hotel, Malahide, Co. Dublin

Portmarnock Hotel and Golf Links



Situated on the shoreline of a rugged peninsula, The Links Portmarnock was the first golf course that International Management Group (IMG) developed in Ireland and opened for play in 1995. It was therefore fitting that Bernhard Langer chose this magnificent setting to design his first links course being a three time winner of the Irish Open at nearby Portmarnock Golf Club and The Royal Dublin Golf Club.



Along with architect Stan Eby they designed a course that is a challenge for all golfers, set in the grounds of the old Jameson Estate of St. Marnocks, the course has played host to professional and amateur events including 2008 and 2009 Ladies Irish Open



The recent investment programme by new owners Kennedy Wilson includes, upgraded machinery, extensive upgrades of the course, the creation of a short game area, riveting of traditional links pot bunkers, grass pathway and enhancements that make full use of the dunes and natural terrain.

St Anne's Golf Club



Situated on Bull Island, just off Dublin Bay, St. Anne's is a compact links course with many of the holes running parallel to each other between low lying sand hills that add character and definition to a fairly flat landscape. The four short holes here are all challenging, particularly those at the 3rd and 10th, where small water hazards come into play close to the green. The toughest hole on the card is "Brent," a 476-yard par four that doglegs slightly left to a semi-blind green, with out of bounds lurking to the right of the fairway.



Interestingly, a number of greens and teeing areas on the back nine of the course were replaced when Dublin's famous Croke Park stadium was reconstructed at the start of the new millennium and this process involved the careful lifting and relaying of hallowed turf from the old GAA pitch onto designated areas of the St. Anne's site.

Howth Golf Club



Featuring wonderful views over the city of Dublin. Looking south, we have Dun Laoghaire, Bray and Co. Wickow, North over Co. Dublin and Co. Louth and the Sea to the East. On a clear day you can see as far as the Mountains of Mourne in Co. Down.

Founded in 1916, this heath land links style course was designed by the renowned golfer and course architect James Briad, a five times winner of “The Open” golf championship who can count the design of the prestigious Kings and Queens Courses at Gleneagles amongst his greatest achievements. James was well known for including dog leg design holes in his course design and the 5th hole is an excellent example how he blended a great golf hole with the unique Howth Heathers. The exceptional view from 16th are worthy of a mention in any golf guide.



Malahide Golf Club



Designed by Eddie Hackett, Malahide Golf Club combines the pleasant ambience of parkland with the whiff of salty sea air.

Founded by Nathaniel Hone, a renowned landscape painter, Malahide is one of Ireland's oldest golf clubs, inaugurated in 1892 as a pure links course. As the sea threatened, over the years the course moved entirely inland.

The present layout of 27 holes is the design of Eddie Hackett, laid out in 1991 combines the pleasant ambience of parkland with the whiff of salty sea air. It provides an interesting contrast to the classic links courses at nearby Portmarnock, The Island and Royal Dublin. The three loops of nine holes – Red, Blue and Yellow – can be divided into a choice of playing combinations. All three closing holes are exciting and bring you back to the excellent clubhouse.

Malahide is typified by dogleg holes, and water hazards, which ensure the need for accuracy throughout. There are a few blind shots to encounter and it's also a challenge to find the sanctuary of the putting surface on a few of the greens which are realised. Although the course is parkland in nature, the proximity of the sea ensures that the wind is often an additional problem to counter



Corrstown Golf Club



The twenty-seven-hole Golf Course at Corrstown is divided into three nine-hole units. This configuration, along with the dedication and commitment of our greens staff ensures we can present to you an excellently maintained and challenging Golf Course at all times.

Though relatively new, opened in 1993 (Orchard Course) and 1995 (River and Meadow Courses), this superb Eddie Connaughton designed complex has matured beyond its years. Testing all levels of golfers, the course, with clever placing of bunkers, thoughtful water usage, and copious trees will ensure you enjoy a truly great golfing experience.
